**Notes:**

- \* At age 18 (up to age 21 in school and still a dependent), if the Associate applies for Regular membership within 1-year, the club will waive the Initiation Fee.

## KETTLEFOOT MEMBERSHIP TIERS

### **Bronze Member:**

Regular - \$210/year

Senior - \$160/year

#### Notes:

- \* Annual fees subject to any increase as may be necessary in the future.
- \* Club usage may be limited if “Hours of Operation” are ever put in place.
- \* A bronze member is eligible for Silver Membership after one year.
- \* Spouses and/or Dependent Children are allowed access under the “Guest” policy only. Remember to sign your quests in at the main club house.

### **Silver Member:**

Regular - \$300/year

Senior - \$250/year

#### Notes:

- \* Silver Membership may be purchased outright or earned by paying Bronze dues and working 8 hours or more per month to make up the balance.
- \* Silver Members will have 24/7 access to the club, even if the club goes to “Hours of Operation” in the future.
- \* Silver Members are welcome to attend Business Meetings to participate in decisions relating to Kettlefoot, Inc. and are eligible to serve on the Board of Directors of Kettlefoot, Inc.
- \* Silver Members are eligible for discounts on Shooting Fees, Supplies, and other Club related expenses.
- \* Only Silver Members will have the option to apply for a Life Membership, if offered in the future.
- \* Silver Membership includes spouses.
- \* Silver Members may apply and will be given first priority for any paid positions that become available.
- \* Only Silver Members may serve on the Board of Directors or hold office in Kettlefoot, Inc.

## **CLUB & RANGE RULES**

(Posted at club house and every range)

1. Top priority each and every time you use the club facility – **SAFETY**: Never assume anything! Always verify before you fire that no one is down range and always verify that the entire firing line is clear before you proceed down range. Follow all rules of gun safety, treat every firearm as if it is loaded, always **THINK and THINK AGAIN** about where your muzzle is pointed, and check your action every time you handle a gun. Use only the correct ammo for your specific gun. **NO Tracer or Incendiary Ammo Allowed** anywhere on Club Property. **\*\*Use the Red Light at the main rifle range when you go hang targets.**
2. No firearm/bow may be used on any range other than the range designated for that specific firearm/bow. In other words, no shotguns or bows on the pistol range; no rifles, shotguns, or pistols on the archery range; etc. On the Auxiliary Range, you may use any non-fully automatic firearm. Exceptions – Upper Rifle Range – slug shotguns and target sighted or scoped long range pistols (including black powder revolvers) may be shot from sand bag/benched or standing off-hand positions. Use extreme caution and **NEVER** rapid fire or quick draw firearms.
3. **NEVER** shoot at glass or other non-biodegradable targets on any range.
4. **ALWAYS** keep firearms pointed downrange and only fire directly downrange. Never crossfire at a target. As an example, do not fire from position #10 at target #15.
5. All firearms must be unloaded, broken open, and/or display an empty chamber flag until you are on the firing line ready to fire.
6. Fully automatic firearms are allowed following posted guidelines (copy included).
7. Hearing and eye protection (where appropriate or posted) are required on all ranges.
8. No shot larger than number 7 ½ is to be used on Club property. The only exception is when firing at the shotgun patterning board located next to the trap field.
9. Use only Kettlefoot traps & targets. Absolutely no personal/hand traps allowed.
10. Pick up your brass, hulls and trash. Take pride in the appearance of your club.
11. **DO NOT** give your Gate Code to anyone.
12. When entering and exiting the property, always use the right-hand road where the split is.
13. Absolutely **NO HUNTING** on club property at any time!
14. **NO** drugs or alcohol are permitted on the firing/shooting line at any range at any time. **NEVER** consume drugs or alcohol and then resume shooting. Public drunkenness will not be tolerated and is grounds for loss of membership. Under **NO CIRCUMSTANCES** will alcohol ever be provided by a club official. Do not drink alcohol or take drugs that may affect your judgement or vision before you come to the range to shoot.
15. Take sponsoring a new member seriously and recommend only those people you actually know.
16. Rude/Unsportsmanlike conduct and/or failure to abide by the club rules will result in suspension or permanent loss of membership.
17. Willful vandalism and/or fraud will result in loss of membership and, where appropriate, prosecution.
18. **ALWAYS** check the Specific Rules posted at each range. Any questions, talk with a Range Coordinator or club officer.
19. You **MUST** have your membership card with you at all times, and preferably visible on your person while on club property.
20. Members **MUST** accompany their guest(s).
21. Parents **MUST** supervise children at all times. Failure to do so means suspension of privileges and/or loss of membership. Please make sure children know and follow all safety rules.
22. Members assume all responsibility for their guest(s) behavior and safe handling of firearms.
23. **GUESTS** – You **MUST** sign your Guest(s) in, pick up a Guest Sticker and sign a club waiver. **\*\*Your spouse and children are considered guests also and must be signed in accordingly. (The Sign-in-Sheet and Stickers are on a clipboard hanging on the back wall of the main club house)**

## **KETTLEFOOT RANGES AND SCHEDULES**

**Archery:** Practice targets with marked ranges from 10yds to 50yds are available all year round to Club Members. The archery range is located on the left at the entrance gate.

**Shotgun:** All shotgun disciplines have Leagues and events on a weekly and monthly basis. One trap and one skeet field has a money machine/ tokens and lights which allow members to shoot 24 hours a day, 7 days a week all year round. There are also Shooting Cards (10 rounds each) available for purchase.

**Automated Ranges:** 5 Stand, and Fields #1 & #2 Skeet, and Field #1 trap are automated. Purchase a WIFI-card for \$10 (refundable when card turned in). Put as much money on the card as you want and shoot rounds until your money runs out. Instructions are provided on how to use the system when you purchase your card. \*Purchase WIFI cards at the club house any Sunday from 12-2pm, 1st and 4th Saturdays from 10am until 2pm, or contact club president.

**Trophy Shoots:** This match is just for fun so the targets are not registered. Members and non-members are all welcome. The match consists of 50 trap and 50 skeet singles targets and 50 sporting clay targets. Awards are presented to the "High Overall" and "Class" winners. Matches are held on the 1st Saturday of each month.

**5-Stand:** There are 2 ranges - one behind the warehouse and the other next to Skeet Field #1. From time to time, special events will be posted on the website calendar and the big calendar on the wall at the main club house. Both ranges are self-service.

**Skeet:** Skeet fields open all year round and Fields #1 and #2 are fully automated. A few Registered Shoots are held each year. These matches are posted on the website calendar.

**Trap:**

**ATA Registered Shoots:** Big 50 events are held Thursdays, March through November. Monthly shoots are held on the 4<sup>th</sup> Saturday of each month, March through November - May excluded. Check the Kettlefoot website for start times.

## **Rimfire:**

USRA-IR50/50: Kettlefoot hosts matches for IR 50/50. A 22 caliber rimfire rifle benchrest competition that tests a competitor's shooting skills from the bench under limitations specified in the rules. Three classes, 13 ½ lb., 10 ½ lb., and Sporter (7 ½ lb.), are designed to place competitors on an equal footing. Matches are contested at 50 yards and 50 meters. For those who prefer fewer restrictions, check out 50/50 UNLIMITED. Shoot well locally and gain national recognition within the "Shooter of the Year" program (SOTY) or travel around having fun along the way gaining points for "THE LIST" and moving up in the Unlimited "SCORELINE". ARA (American Rimfire Association): A .22 caliber Rifle competition that challenges one's shooting skills from the bench at 50 yards. Classes are available for both unlimited and factory guns. These matches are held year-round. Also check out [www.americanrimfire.com](http://www.americanrimfire.com) for additional information.

Silhouette: These shoots are held on Thursdays at 5:30pm from May through September and the second Sunday afternoon October through April. This shoot consists of engaging steel animal targets from 75, 125, 165 and 200 yards. Each shooter will engage a total of 40 animal targets and 4 bonus targets per match.

Indoor League: Thursdays at 5:30pm from October through April. Open Sights, Unlimited Peep, Plinker, Sporter, Sporter Unlimited, Auto, Target, Target Unlimited, Unlimited and Unlimited Plus are classes shot.

PRS: These matches are held on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Saturday of each Month.

## **Centerfire:**

UBR: Check out [www.ultimatebenchrest.com](http://www.ultimatebenchrest.com) for additional information. These matches are held on the 2<sup>nd</sup> Saturday from May through October, with exception of September when no match is held.

**Pistol:** We have two pistol ranges. (1) The lower range (first range on the right after you come thru the gate) has 25 yard & 50 yard frames. This range is for paper targets only. (2) The upper range (directly across from the center fire rifle range) has a total of 10 bays. This is called the "Auxiliary/Pistol" Range. You may use any legal firearm on this range. It is also where the monthly Kettlefoot Defensive Pistol Association(KDPA), USPSA and Steel Challenge matches are held. We also have a shelter and small bore range on the upper level between the warehouse and the club house.

KDPA Matches: Matches are based on tactical reality in self-defense shooting scenarios. Each match is supervised by Safety Officers and Match Directors who ensure that safety is paramount and that each match is conducted appropriately within the subjective competition rules of the KDPA. Full description found on the club website. These matches are open to members as well

as non-members and are held the 4th Saturday of each month (from January to December), beginning at 9:00am.

USPSA Matches: United States Practical Shooting Association. Each match is supervised by Safety Officers and Match Directors who ensure that safety is paramount and that each match is conducted appropriately within the subjective competition rules of the USPSA. Full description found on the club website. These matches are open to members as well as non-members and are held the 3rd Saturday of each month (from January to December). New shooter briefing at 9:00am, match starts at 10:00am.

Steel Challenge: These matches are held on the 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday of each month.

## USE OF FULL AUTO FIREARMS

These firearms may be used on the Main Rifle Range and at the Auxiliary Bays during daylight hours **only**.

### Rules

1. **All** firearms usage will be conducted in a SAFE manner for the shooter as well as other shooters on the range. This includes exercising all necessary safety procedures to **limit muzzle rise**.
2. It is **mandatory** that an adult, at least **21 years of age**, maintain firearm control at **all** times.
3. Shooters **WILL** extend common courtesy to fellow shooters and limit extraordinary distractions by limiting large amounts of automatic fire in order to allow bench rest shooters adequate time for slow fire shooting.
4. Club property **WILL BE** respected and attention given to minimizing damage to the range - such as causing excessive ruts and destruction of target backer board supports.
5. When using a steel reactive target (on the main rifle range only), the shooter will limit use to 100 yards or greater with rifle calibers and 50 yards or greater with pistol calibers.
6. **All** automatic firearms must be legally owned by the individual member.\*\*

\*\*With regard to ensuring that all automatic and NFA firearms are legally owned, the club retains the right to review all pertinent ATF forms (Form 4 and/or SOTs).

\*\*It is also recommended that all NFA firearms be covered by ATF Form #5320.20 indicating the club name and physical street address (Kettlefoot, Inc., DBA Kettlefoot Rod & Gun Club, 21101 Kettlefoot Lane, Bristol, VA 24201).

CLARIFICATION: FORM #5320.20 IS NEEDED ONLY IF YOU ARE NOT A VIRGINIA RESIDENT. IT IS NECESSARY IN ORDER TO BE ABLE TO TRANSPORT THE FIREARM ACROSS STATE LINES.

Any shooter with an NFA firearm without documentation will be asked to remove the firearm from the club premises immediately.
